This document describes the City process moving forward as it pertains to the Dixon Branch Flood Study.

Step 1

City council committee is briefed on the selected Alternative, which replaces channel modifications as the selected flood control solution for this project. The selected flood control solution is then placed on the City's Needs Inventory for future bond consideration.

Step 2

In a future bond program (possibly 2010), staff and City council members will meet and make recommendations for projects to consider in each council district. The projects cover a wide range of public improvements, from drainage to transportation-related activities, for example. A rating system is used to prioritize each project.

Step 3

During the bond program development, upcoming town hall meetings will be posted on the City of Dallas website (www.dallascityhall.com). Residents in each district should receive an invitational flyer in the mail informing them of upcoming meetings. The Freese and Nichols website (<http://clients.freese.com/dallas/dixonbranch/>) will also have updates on any future town hall meeting. Public comment is no longer available on this website.

Step 4

At the town hall meeting, citizens who favor this flood control solution should voice their support for this project. Keep in mind there are other needs in this district.

Step 5

If the Dixon Branch project is selected, it must be approved by City council to be placed on a future bond program.

If this project is not selected from a town hall meeting or denied by City council to be placed on the next bond program, it will be placed back onto the Needs Inventory for future bond consideration.

Step 6

If approved by City council to be placed on a future bond program, we need your support in voting for this project in the appropriate bond category.
